
HOCO? OH NO...

\$30.00 per person, not including the touch pass and the VIP pass, which are extra. Tickets for this haunted house should be booked in advance, because tickets are limited and sell out guite guickly.

If you are willing to drive a little further, the Haunted Schoolhouse and Laboratory, located at 1300 Triplett Blvd., Akron OH 44306, offers a creepy and disturbing performance.
